

**Proposition 133**  
**Primary Elections; Eligible Candidates**  
**Fiscal Analysis**

**Estimated Impact**

Proposition 133 would amend the Arizona Constitution to require that any primary election law must allow each qualified political party to nominate a number of candidates equal to the number of positions to be filled at the General Election for that office. In addition, the measure would mandate that any primary election law enacted by the Legislature supersedes any contrary primary election law adopted by a city.

The provision relating to the number of candidates nominated by a qualified political party is not expected to have a fiscal impact as it would not require any changes to current state or local government primary election laws.

The provision relating to contrary city primary election laws may require local governments to change their primary election processes, however, the local fiscal impact of any required changes is expected to be minimal.
