## Selected State Expenditures on Counties <br> Program Summary

JLBC Staff estimates that the state distributes at least an estimated $\$ 2.66$ billion to counties annually. Sizeable distributions to counties include portions of the Vehicle License Tax ( $\$ 384$ million) and the Highway User Revenue Fund ( $\$ 330$ million), along with $\$ 330$ million of General Fund monies spent on the Arizona Long Term Care System (ALTCS) program in AHCCCS. Also included are the State Shared Transaction Privilege Tax (TPT) revenues - at more than $\$ 1.4$ billion, those revenues accounted for about 52.4\% of total county distributions. Compared to our last report in February 2023, total distributions to counties increased by $\$ 4.27$ million, or $0.2 \%$.

Including the TPT distribution, the Treasurer distributes $\$ 1.43$ billion to counties, or $53.6 \%$ of the total. In addition, the Department of Transportation (ADOT) allocates $\$ 714$ million, or $26.8 \%$ of the total. Other large agency contributions include AHCCCS with $\$ 334$ million ( $12.5 \%$ ) and the Judiciary with $\$ 112.1$ million ( $4.2 \%$ ). Table 1 provides a summary of the amount of monies distributed to each county and the share this number represents.

## Program Notes

ADOA
Election Security Grants: The FY 2023 General Appropriation Act includes $\$ 1,500,000$ from the General Fund for ADOA's Election Security Grants Line Item which includes \$1,000,000 for ADOA to distribute as grants to county recorders to test ballot paper and $\$ 500,000$ for ballot box surveillance in Cochise, Yuma, and Pinal Counties. The budget does not specify a distribution.

Emergency Telecommunications Fund: These non-appropriated funds are distributed to counties for expanding 9-1-1 service.
School Safety Interoperability Fund: The FY 2023 General Appropriation Act includes $\$ 20,000,000$ from the School Safety Interoperability Fund for county sheriffs and city police departments.

## AHCCCS

 ALTCS payments thereby lowering the cost to the counties. The state pays for $50 \%$ of ALTCS growth. The counties also receive breaks from the state based on: net assessed property value, onreservation population of at least $20 \%$, and per capita income lower than the statewide per capita income. These are commonly referred to as "circuit breakers."

Disproportionate Share Hospital Payment (DSH): This program provides additional payments to hospitals in counties that serve a disproportionate number of low-income patients. The amount listed above is distributed to the Maricopa Integrated Health System (Valleywise).

## County Funding

Coordinated Reentry Planning Services: The FY 2024 General Appropriation Act includes $\$ 7,000,000$ from the General Fund to ADOA for distribution to counties to establish a coordinated reentry planning services program. The budget does not specify a distribution for the FY 2023 appropriation.
General Fund County Disbursements: The FY 2024 General Appropriation Act includes $\$ 7,150,650$ from the General Fund to be divided equally between all counties except for Maricopa and Pima Counties. An additional $\$ 500,000$ is allocated to Graham County on an ongoing basis.

State Aid to County Attorneys: In FY 2024, $\$ 1,406,409$ appropriated from the State Aid to County Attorneys Fund provides funding for various offices of county attorneys throughout Arizona to improve the processing of criminal cases. ACJC is required to distribute the monies to each county based on a composite index formula using Superior Court felony filings and county population. Distributions are subject to available revenue in the fund. These amounts reflect FY 2024 distributions.

State Aid to Indigent Defense: The FY 2023 General Appropriation Act includes $\$ 700,000$ from the State Aid to Indigent Defense Fund for processing of criminal cases by the offices of the public
 felony filings and county population. These amounts reflect FY 2024 distributions.

Child Support Enforcement: Funds are distributed to all Arizona counties except Apache and Greenlee to provide clerk of the court and family law support services. These amounts reflect FY 2024 estimates.

Antihuman Trafficking Grant Fund: The FY 2023 General Appropriation Act includes $\$ 8,000,000$ from the Antihuman Trafficking Grant Fund to distribute to city, town, and county law enforcement agencies for programs that reduce human trafficking.
Border-Related Crime Cost Reimbursement: The FY 2023 General Appropriation Act includes $\$ 30,000,000$ for distribution to cities, towns and counties for costs associated with prosecuting and imprisoning individuals charged with border-related crimes.

Cochise County Jail: The FY 2023 General Appropriation Act includes $\$ 20,000,000$ from the Border Security Fund to distribute to Cochise County for up to $20 \%$ of the costs to construct a county jail. The budget stipulates that the state share of construction costs shall not exceed $\$ 20,000,000$ and that these monies not be distributed until Cochise County has submitted a report to JLBC, OSPB, and ADOA that the county has raised sufficient monies to fund the remainder of the project's budget. Monies that remain unspent on June 30, 2027 will revert to the Border Security Fund.

ICE Program Participation Cost Reimbursement: The FY 2023 General Appropriation Act includes $\$ 15,000,000$ to reimburse county or local law enforcement agencies for costs incurred for participating in a program with the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE).

## Forestry and Fire Management

Environmental County Grants: In FY 2024, \$250,000 was appropriated from the General Fund to be divided equally between 5 counties (Apache, Gila, Graham, Greenlee, and Yavapai) for environmental projects that impact economic development in those counties.

## Governor

County Fair Racing and Agriculture Promotion: The Governor's Office receives these appropriated funds from the Department of Gaming, and then passes them on to counties for fairs.

It receives monies from cigarette tax revenues in the Health Education Account. These amounts are FY 2023 estimates.
Tobacco Education and Prevention Expenditures: Monies provided to counties from the Department Health Services' Health Education Account, funded from tobacco tax dollars. These amounts are FY 2023 estimates.

## Judiciary

Adult Intensive Probation Supervision: This type of probation is a sentencing alternative intended to divert serious, non-violent offenders from prison. These resources are distributed from the General Fund and Other Funds directly to the counties.

Adult Standard Probation: These probationers are not considered a serious threat to security. These resources are distributed from the General Fund and Other Funds directly to the counties.
Aid to Courts: These funds provide aid to counties for the payment of judges pro tempore salaries, and for projects designed to improve the processing of criminal cases in the Superior and Justice Courts. These are Other Funds monies and are given directly to Superior Courts and Justice Courts; counties administer these courts. These funds are distributed based on a county's pro-rata share of population and felony filings.
Community Punishment: This program provides behavioral treatment services for adult probationers and provides enhanced supervision. These are Other Funds monies and are given directly to all counties except Maricopa.
Compensation for Judges: Judges Compensation is the state's $50 \%$ portion of salary and Employee Related Expenditures of Superior Court judges. These monies are from the General Fund and are distributed directly to counties.
Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA): This program administers and monitors a community-based volunteer advocacy program for abused and neglected children in the Juvenile Court System. These are Other Funds monies and are given directly to counties.
Drug and Gang Enforcement: This account enhances the courts' ability to process drug offenses and related cases. These are Other Funds monies and are given directly to counties. Drug Court: Provides the Superior Courts throughout the state with drug courts. These are General Fund monies and are given directly to counties.
Drug Treatment and Education: This fund provides monies to place people on education and treatment for drugs. These are Other Funds monies and are given directly to counties. Grand Jury/Post-Conviction Relief: These are General Fund monies for county grand jury expenses and for the costs of state-funded representation of indigent defendants.
Interstate Compact: This program provides funding for supervision of, and intervention to, probationers transferring to Arizona. These are General Fund and Other Funds monies and are given directly to counties.

Juvenile Diversion Consequences: This program diverts youths from formal court proceedings in order to reduce court costs and prevent re-offending. These monies are General Fund and are given directly to counties.
Juvenile Diversion Intake: The intake portion of the Juvenile Diversion program which diverts youths from formal court proceedings in order to reduce court costs and prevent re-offending. These are General Fund monies and are given directly to counties.
Juvenile Family Counseling: Provides funding to the Juvenile Division of the Superior Court for prevention of delinquency by strengthening family relationships. These are General Fund monies and are given directly to counties.
Juvenile Intensive Probation: This program diverts serious, non-violent offenders from incarceration or residential care. This program also provides intensive supervision for high-risk offenders already on probation. These resources are distributed from the General Fund directly to the counties.

Juvenile Standard Probation: This program provides community supervision for juveniles. These resources are distributed from the General Fund and Other Funds directly to the counties.
Juvenile Treatment Services: Provides juvenile courts with money to refer delinquent youths to treatment programs. These monies are General Fund and are given directly to counties.
Model Court: These are pass-through funds from the General Fund to the counties. These funds are to improve the processing of dependency cases.
Public Defender Training: This program provides monies for the training of public defenders. These are Other Fund monies and are given directly to counties.
Probation Incentive Payments: The FY 2022 General Appropriation Act appropriated $\$ 1,000,000$ from the General Fund for 2 funding programs to reward counties for reducing the number of probationers that are returned to state prison. Distribution of the grant funding is determined by a board consisting of the chief probation officers of each county. The amount distributed to each county from these programs is subject to available funding.

$\overline{\text { Gang }}$ and Immigration Intelligence Team Enforcement Mission Fund (GIITEM): Monies in this fund can be used for employer sanctions, smuggling, gang, and immigration enforcement. The total appropriation from the General Fund for FY 2023 is $\$ 1,403,400$

GIITEM Subaccount: In FY 2023, $\$ 2,396,400$ is appropriated from this account. These funds will be distributed to county sheriffs. These monies are from the GIITEM Fund Border Security and Law Enforcement Subaccount (Other Funds).

SOS
Election Reimbursements: Reimbursements to counties for costs of administering elections. Due no primary or general elections scheduled in FY 2022, there were no disbursements.
ADOT
Highway User Revenue Fund (HURF): The State of Arizona taxes motor fuels and imposes various other fees related to the registration and operation of motor vehicles. These funds are distributed to counties, cities, towns, and the State Highway Fund.
State Aviation Fund: Monies used for planning and developing publicly-owned aviation facilities.
Vehicle License Tax: Monies are distributed to county highway and General Funds.
Treasurer
Criminal Justice Enhancement Fund (CJEF): In FY 2023, the Treasurer received \$3,517,347 in non-appropriated CJEF monies to pass on to county sheriffs.
Justice of the Peace Salaries: The state pays $40 \%$ of the Justice of the Peace salaries from the General Fund.
Law Enforcement Boating and Safety Fund (LEBSF): Monies in this fund provide grants to county law enforcement agencies for water and boating safety programs. These monies are from a portion of watercraft licensing taxes and operating a watercraft while under the influence fees.

State Shared Transaction Privilege Tax (TPT): TPT is shared with counties and cities along with the General Fund through formulas established in statute.
